TAMFT PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE: RECAPPING TAMFT 2023 CONFERENCE

I write this after having returned from the TAMFT 2023 Conference in Austin, and what an amazing conference it was! On at least 3 occasions during the conference, I noted how despite working in marriage and family therapy for more than 20 years, I get my mind blown at every TAMFT conference I attend, thrilled by the lessons I've learned and the people I've met. Serving as President of TAMFT has been a great honor and privilege, and I was especially privileged this year to have a front-row seat to the amazing speakers and workshops throughout our time together in Austin. I was inspired by Travis Heath to challenge my practice of systemic therapy, digging into the unique power and opportunities that systemic practices present. I was challenged by Eliza Boquin and Eboni Harris to examine how I may not always provide the most welcoming therapeutic environment for the Black and Latinx communities and to do so better. I was informed by Ana Marcela Rodriguez and Diana Beltran about the unique challenges of the Hispanic community, both inside and outside the therapeutic framework. Each of these speakers and many others informed us, challenged us, and encouraged us to grow our

awareness of our clients and create better practices for those we serve.

However, the benefits of the conference did not end with the sessions. As always, one of the best aspects was connecting with people I do not otherwise encounter. Texas is a large state, and while telehealth has shrunk things a bit, it is still difficult for colleagues in Lubbock to connect with those in Beaumont, but that happens every year at the TAMFT conference. My professional life is greatly enhanced by those relationships. This year in particular, I was encouraged by the student participation and enthusiasm at the conference. Students are always a major factor at conference, from volunteering to make it happen to presenting posters and sessions. But this year, the enthusiasm and advocacy on the part of students was particularly notable. TAMFT is excited to have such a vibrant and active student body, and I'm excited to work with Student Representative on the Board, Jaida Pryor, to make sure that TAMFT is serving them as best we can.

Finally, I want to mention the great legislative work that was

done at Day at the Dome on Wednesday before conference.

This biennial event is critical for getting the voices of MFTs heard in the Texas legislature. If you were not able to attend Day at the Dome, I highly encourage you to take part when it returns in 2025. Legislative advocacy is arguably the most important role of TAMFT, and Day at the Dome is a great way to directly engage with legislators to make sure they know about MFTs and the issues that affect our practice.

Thank you to the conference organizers, committee members, and Stansfeld staff for creating a great event, and I'm eager to see you all again next year. As always, thank you all for the work you do.

For those who are regular attendees of the conference, you likely know the struggle that is trying to balance your time between attending your breakout sessions and skipping those workshops for an important discussion with a long-time (or brand new)



colleague. Oh? Just me? C'mon, you know you've done it before! It was hard this year, though. The conference committee put on such an unforgettable experience and the kinds of topics that our members presented on were all crucial subjects that deserve our attention. I greatly appreciate our growing momentum toward including more diverse voices in TAMFT's dialogues. Let's keep that up, yeah?

In truth, this momentum toward diversity is arguably a core piece of the systemic legacy, isn't it? Please forgive me, but I'm about to make 98% of you feel old: I just turned 26 two weeks before the publication of this newsletter (yes, I was born in 1997). Depending on your attitude toward Gen Z, I imagine this fact either makes you a little anxious or somewhat excited. What will Gen Z do with the field of Couple and Family Therapy? How will our experiences as cohorts shape the future of this profession? These are big questions that deserve their own rigorous research, but I will share this much: perhaps it's fair to say there's much for us to be critical about. Looking around, there seems to be a whole lot that just doesn't work well anymore – or maybe it never did, at least not for everyone.

How do I therapize teenagers (muchless plan my career) in light of the latest IPCC report? How am I supposed to mend this family cutoff when the U.S. political climate is the textbook definition of "pernicious polarization"? Pandemics. Mass shootings. Climate crisis. Wealth gap. How do I help clients find their power and hope when there's so much to feel hopeless and powerless about – especially as a gender-queer person at a time like this? In the words of conference keynote, Travis Heath, how do I help folks change their relationship to these systems when I'm not even satisfied with my own?

Well... talk about it, I guess. I talk about it with my trans friends and my people who have proven themselves safe. I talk about it with my therapist, and encourage the public to talk about their issues with their therapists. And I'm going to talk about it here. Because I want TAMFT to be a place where we can do that. If you're reading this and disagree with that vision, I hope you'll feel comfortable enough to reach out and talk with me about our differences (I, for one, have had enough of the alternative to that option). We're therapists. Whether at a conference or in the therapy room, listening and peacemaking through conversation is what we do. As long as we keep doing that, there's reason to hope that things can get better.

DAY AT THE DOME TIM WHITE, MEMBER-AT-LARGE AND PAC CHAIRMAN

I am pleased to report that we had a tremendous turnout for our 2023 Day at the Dome! I am so happy for the demonstrated commitment and strong showing of support by those TAMFT members who were able to take part in this important advocacy activity. There were over 40 participants who stormed the Capitol, meeting and speaking with senators, representatives, and their staff about public policy and regulatory issues facing our profession during this legislative session.

TAMFT's visible engagement at the Capitol during session years compliments our advocacy efforts greatly! This is a very busy year for proposed legislation

regarding various aspects of mental health. In particular, there are 15 bills directly mentioning LMFTs, Associates, and students, over 150 other proposed bills that potentially impact MFTs, and over 37 relating to BHEC!

The TAMFT Legislative Committee, along with our legislative consultant, Tristan "Tris" Castaneda's help, identified <u>three specific issues to bring to the attention of legislators</u>, encouraging their support. Of further interest, an interim report by a Senate Special Committee, colloquially referred to as the "<u>Uvalde Report</u>" provided recommendations seeking to improve access to mental health across the board for our school systems.

Finally, I would like to encourage everyone to get involved in some way in the TAMFT! As Margaret Mead famously said: "Never doubt that a small group of thoughtful, committed citizens can change the world, indeed, it's the only thing that ever has!"

TAMFT 2023 ANNUAL CONFERENCE: BEHIND THE SCENES

TAMFT is an organization that runs on the passion and dedication of our volunteers. One of the most tangible products that TAMFT volunteers offer is the annual conference. Each year, hundreds of MFTs and friends of the field gather for continuing education and networking. For many TAMFT members, the conference excitement begins with Early Bird Registration a few months before the scheduled event.



The excitement builds as workshop titles are released, and attendees create their schedules. The conference preparation for most attendees might look something like this:

- 1. Coffee
- 2. Therapist attire
- 3. Business cards
- 4. Water bottle
- 5. Snacks
- 6. Notebook and pen
- 7. Email long-lost colleagues to connect over lunch

Our Conference Committee members love to watch TAMFT members reconnect with one another and reignite their passion for the field over the course of three days. The ten (plus) months of planning are more than worth the experience. (Yes, you read that right.) The Conference Committee begins planning at least ten months in advance to make the magic happen! We're taking you behind the scenes to learn more about conference planning.

Here's a year in the life of a Conference Committee member -

11 months out:

- Conference Committee begins monthly meetings
- Previous conference survey is reviewed
- Strengths and opportunities are addressed
- Location is chosen, and hotel is booked



TAMFT 2023 ANNUAL CONFERENCE: BEHIND THE SCENES by kelsey austin, member-at-large and conference co-chair

The 2023 annual conference was booked in Austin, Texas, to carry out TAMFT's Day at the Dome tradition. Day at the Dome provides members with the opportunity to visit Texas senators and representatives at the Texas Capitol with other colleagues and conferencegoers. We do this very important activity to connect with those lawmakers and inform them of our support or opposition to bills coming up in this year's legislative session.

10-8 months out:

- Conference committee begins meeting every 2 weeks
- Conference theme is chosen
- Blurb is written
- Keynote speakers are discussed

The Conference Committee was extremely selective when discussing potential keynote speakers for the 2023 annual conference. The committee factored in feedback from



previous conferences, current trends and issues in Texas mental health, and attention to diverse and inclusive presentations. We wanted to bring in content that was relevant, engaging, and applicable to our members' daily practice. We scheduled meetings with each keynote speaker to discuss our vision for the conference and share ideas regarding how they could provide value to our members. Rather than lectures, we were searching for storytellers that would engage the audience in conversations and experiential activities that would light a fire to be more competent, inclusive, and systemic therapists. The feedback we've received regarding the 2023 keynote speakers has let us know we hit the mark!

This extensive planning requires organization and attention to detail. The Conference Committee stays connected via Slack between Zoom meetings to discuss progress and setbacks. We also use Google Drive to store email templates, calls for proposals, meeting agendas, and notes. Each meeting ends with delegations of tasks to each member, noted in the meeting minutes. Despite being spread across Texas, our Committee stays very connected virtually to create a conference that delivers.

The work is unpaid and sometimes quite exhausting, but the feedback from satisfied and inspired TAMFT members has us counting down until planning begins for next year!

The results of this tireless work? A bustling room of aspiring MFTs mingling with seasoned specialists eagerly awaiting the first keynote of the conference. Networking with strangers over a partnered conversation during a presentation, we often learn and gain inspiration from one another. Standing ovations for speakers that rocked our worlds. A jam-packed room of ground-breaking research presented by the future of our field. Satiated intellectual appetites at the end of each long day. We hosted 41 workshops, boasted four keynote presentations, and provided numerous opportunities for attendees to connect with fellow professionals. This year, we were proud to see 335 attendees gathered for learning, laughter, and long-lived connection. We hope to see you all again next spring!

Everyone, we had such a good turnout for Day at the Dome and I'm so happy for the support. Of further interest, a document drafted by a Senate Special Committee, that has been colloquially referred to as the "Uvalde Report", specifically references better access to mental health across the board for our school systems. Finally, we would like to encourage everyone to get involved in some way in the TAMFT as we have the potential to impact real change in advocating for our license.



Our upcoming webinar, "Identifying and Serving Survivors of Human Trafficking," is scheduled for Friday, April 28th, and will feature leaders from Aware Central Texas, a dual domestic violence/sexual assault program based in Killeen, Texas. Their expertise on this important topic will be invaluable to us as MFTs, as we are uniquely positioned to recognize and assist survivors of human trafficking. Given that we often work with clients who are experiencing relationship difficulties or family conflict, we may come across individuals who are at risk of, or have already been victimized by, trafficking. It is also worth noting that completing human trafficking prevention training is a requirement for Texas LMFT License renewal.

In addition, the Education Committee is planning a webinar in May to help new Master's degree graduates navigate the post-graduate licensing process. We are excited to welcome these new graduates to the next stage of their careers. We encourage all TAMFT members to join us for our monthly webinars, which are free and offer CEUs.

CALL FOR TAMFT 2023 COMMITTEE SERVICE

TAMFT is seeking applications for member volunteers for committee service. Committee members will serve 2-year terms. The TAMFT Committees are as follows:

- **Governance Committee**: Governance Committee enforces TAMFT rules and policies, reviews TAMFT Bylaws and Policies for needed revisions, conducts annual Board self-evaluation, organizes Board and Committee structure, and oversees the Elections Subcommittee. There is also the opportunity for members to volunteer to serve on the Elections Subcommittee.
- **Finance Committee**: Finance Committee collaborates to develop the TAMFT budget for Board approval, receives regular financial reports, reviews and recommends financial policies and operating guidelines, including possible investments, and, if requested by Board, reviews TAMFT financial audit.
- Education Committee: Education Committee organizes and directs education opportunities, including online CEUs, serves as the Steering Committee for the Annual Conference, and explores additional opportunities for member education.
- **Membership Committee**: Membership Committee establishes new recruitment strategies for members, communicates with universities to engage potential new members, communicates with lapsed/expired members to encourage renewals, helps with member marketing campaigns, and administers yearly member surveys. Also oversees the Awards Subcommittee.
- Legislative Committee: Legislative Committee maintains the relationship with the TAMFT lobbyist, helps establish relationships with elected officials and their staffs, prepares updates to members on legislative issues, helps direct TAMFT advocacy efforts, prepares members to meet with legislators or testify, appoints members to or attends TSBEMFT, and BHEC meetings, and oversees Day at the Dome Steering Committee bi-annually.
- **Conference Committee**: Conference Committee organizes the annual conference by reviewing conference budget, choosing the location of the conference, and fees for hotel and speakers. Committee creates theme, logo, and marketing content, and collaborates with management company that will implement the committee's work. Committee will assist in creating calls for abstracts and reviewing abstracts for conference. Committee will choose and contact/contract with keynote speakers. Committee will plan the TSMFT and LMFT-Associate meetings.
- **Communications Committee**: Communications Committee examines all social media that is used by TAMFT to ensure that it reaches and is respectful to all members, examines the website to ensure that it is user-friendly and conducive to creating new memberships, and provides, at the Board's request, suggestions for advertising or marketing services or events of TAMFT.
